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<u>School</u>

Amethyst This week in Amethyst Class, we read the story 'What the Ladybird Heard.' We drew a map of the farm and added labels to show the different characters / locations. We used the pictures to talk about who we would draw next. We consolidated our knowledge of numbers to ten and beyond by playing hopscotch, matching numerals and objects in a snap game, rolling dice and filling tens frames with a partner. We also enjoyed learning about minibeasts, designing bug hotels in the mud kitchen and making bug imprints in playdough.

Sapphire Class Everyone has been working hard and doing a fantastic job this week in Sapphire Class. We've been diving into a new book titled *Toys in Space*, exploring the adventures of toys. We have been writing from their point of view and retelling the story. In Maths, we've also started a new unit focusing on position and direction, mastering key words like 'above', 'below', 'right' and 'left', 'full turn', 'half turn', 'quarter turn' and 'three-quarter turn'. In History, we've been learning about the incredible Mae Jemison, the first black woman in space. The children worked in pairs to create their own fact files. In D&T the class has also been busy constructing their cars, displaying creativity and engineering skills. During PE, we've been sharpening our cricket abilities, and everyone has shown excellent teamwork on the field.

Pearl Class This week the children have been measuring in litres. We have been using the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) in litres and we have been working on temperature. We wrote a description of when Billy saw the giant and we wrote letters to Grandad asking for advice. On Thursday afternoon we enjoyed our trip down to St James' church where we took part in a Christening service. The children were amazing and really valued the experience. We enjoyed our move-up morning to Year 3 with Miss Morris on Friday morning. We have been monitoring our plant investigation, starting to draw conclusions from our observations.

Amber Class This week, year 3 have been practising telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes and calculating durations. They have finished and edited their articles on whales in English. The class have experimented with magnets in their Science lessons and have used a compass to discover North, South, East and West. The children worked on their shading skills in art and practised creating light and dark hues with their pencils. The children have practised considering things from other people's perspectives in their PSHE lessons and they spent a morning in Year 4 as part of their transition for next year.

Emerald Class This week, Emerald Class have been learning how to write a report about anglerfish. The children are really enjoying finding out fascinating facts about this extraordinary fish. They have also been learning how to play rounders and have played some matches against each other. In Maths, the children have been learning about equivalent fractions and how to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers. They have also enjoyed pretending to be kings and council in 'ancient Sparta' and have compared Sparta to Athens finding out that women had a lot more freedom in Sparta.

Ruby Class This week in Year 5 has been both engaging and productive. The students have immersed themselves in a creative writing task, crafting letters to Jamina from the perspective of a chief elephant, allowing their imaginations to roam free while also honing their empathy and narrative skills. In Maths, the focus has been on sequencing decimals, where the children have diligently worked on understanding the order and value of decimal numbers. Additionally, the excitement is building for the end-of-year performance, as the class has begun learning and practicing the songs that they will showcase, adding a musical and collaborative dimension to their week.











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Diamond Class This week, Diamond Class have mainly been focusing on our end of primary school play 'The Wrong Way Round' and have begun to enhance the staging and perform scenes and songs without the aid of backing tracks with vocals. In class, the children have also been writing poems about their favourite memories from primary school and have been watching videos about high school from the perspectives of secondary pupils and teachers from across the UK - Top Tips for the First Day, Myths about High School Teachers, and A Day in the Life of a Secondary School Pupil, as well as Mr Mottram's latest video about PE kits.

Whole school weekly attendance this week is 95.96% which is below our aim of 97%. In EYFS/KS1, Pearl class has again had full attendance this week and In KS2, Diamond class has had the highest attendance. Congratulations to both classes.
