The more books we sell, the more books the school will be awarded. There will be an incentive of 3 for 2 where you can pay for the two most expensive books and the third will be free. ### <u>School</u>

**Amethyst Class** This week in Amethyst Class, we read more of the story 'Supertato' and wrote lists of what we could see happening in the pictures and labelled his appearance. We also made a wanted poster and a trap for the Evil Pea. In maths, we looked at odd and even numbers and put objects into pairs. We read the story 'One Odd Day' by Dani Sneed and made our own odd day picture. We played a barrier game, building models with blocks. In pairs, one partner gave the instructions and saw if their partner could arrange the blocks in the same way.

**Sapphire Class** This week in Sapphire Class we have been having a very busy week! The children have been working so hard on their phonics and they have been doing an excellent job, they should all be very proud of themselves. In English we have been continuing to write our own stories about an adventure in the museum with Oscar. The children have been focusing on writing sentences with a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark. In Maths we have started our new unit on Multiplication and Division. We have been learning to count in 2s, 10s and 5s. This week we have also been playing cricket, singing songs as a class, making moving axels on our cars in D&T, making science posters about materials and their properties and learning about how cars were invented in History.

**Pearl Class** This week the children in Year 2 have started their new book 'Grandad's Secret Giant'. We discussed the blurb and the children drew their predictions of the giant's appearance. In Maths we have completed our unit on 'Time' and we have been learning how to draw and interpret a range of pictograms. In PE we have been practising our skills for sports day and in PSHE we have been discussing the difference between 'needs and wants'. In Science we have made predictions for our investigation using seeds from fruits. In Design and Technology, the children have been exploring and experimenting to work out the most suitable materials and techniques for creating a Ferris wheel model.













**Amber Class** This week, Amber Class have finished their work on fractions and have been doing some revision of addition, subtraction multiplication and division. We have also started our new topic on Time. The children have investigated writing paragraphs on how large whales are and also how they breathe. The children have used subheadings, 2<sup>nd</sup> person and exclamations. The children have continued to work on their touch typing in Computing and their tennis in PE. The class have worked on their Egyptian collars in DT and created zentangle artwork to celebrate the European Championship. The children performed a spectacular set of songs on their recorders at The Musical Showcase.

**Emerald Class** This week, Emerald Class have been completing their Multiplication Tables Check, and we are very proud of how they have approached the tests. They have been practising for some time and deserve a big pat on the back. The children have also been getting ready for the different sporting competitions coming up next week, and we were pleased to be able to send an enthusiastic football team to compete against other local schools at the Crewe Soccer Centre. A big congratulations also to our musicians and choir for showcasing their talents to parents and families at the musical showcase.

**Ruby Class** This week, Ruby class have been working extremely hard in English. The children have completed a conversation between Jamine and her grandfather thinking about how they can add description in between the speech to enhance their writing. In Maths, we have finished our unit on decimal fractions and have now moved onto perimeter and area looking at finding the perimeter of rectangles. In Geography, our South American topic is still in full swing with us now looking in depth at the water cycle and its importance to the Earth's ecosystem. In PE, the children have been practicing the javelin, long jump, relay, sprints and skipping races already for sports day on Friday 21st June.

**Diamond Class** Diamond Class have been working hard on their writing this week, completing stories inspired by Sky Chasers which involve an intense hot air balloon ride. They have also enjoyed their time with Bikeability - learning the rules of the road and how to ride safely amidst traffic. The children have finalised their Primary College choices and have practised for upcoming sporting competitions in PE.

### Attendance this week

Whole school weekly attendance this week is 96.14% which is very close to our aim of 97%. In EYFS/KS1, Pearl class has had full attendance this week and In KS2, Ruby class has the highest attendance. Congratulations to both classes.
